As the 108th Congress opened, the 5-year TANF reauthorization bill passed by the House last year was being readied for reintroduction, effective for FY2004-2008, according to staff of the House Ways and Means Committee. The bill embodies concepts advanced by President Bush in February 2002, including a 40-hour work week for most TANF recipients and a requirement that states eventually engage 70 of recipients in a work activity (up from a general rate of 50 in current law). Last May, on a largely partisan vote, 229197, the House passed the Personal Responsibility, Work, and Family Promotion Act (H.R. 4737) to extend TANF on new terms from FY2003 through FY2007, but the Senate Finance Committee substitute bill, the Work, Opportunity, and Responsibility for Kids Act (WORK, also H.R. 4737), never reached the Senate floor. On several key issues, including work hours, work activities, and child care funding, the bills were far apart. Since October 1, TANF and related programs of mandatory child care, transitional medicaid, and abstinence education have been operating on temporary spending authority, now due to end...
